

Beast from the East



After the 'Beast from the East', a major storm which resulted in a shortage of gas, electricity and food as well as ten fatalities, weather forecasters say another blast of Siberian and Scandinavian winds

It's still unknown how much snow will fall but temperatures are likely to remain under six degrees.
